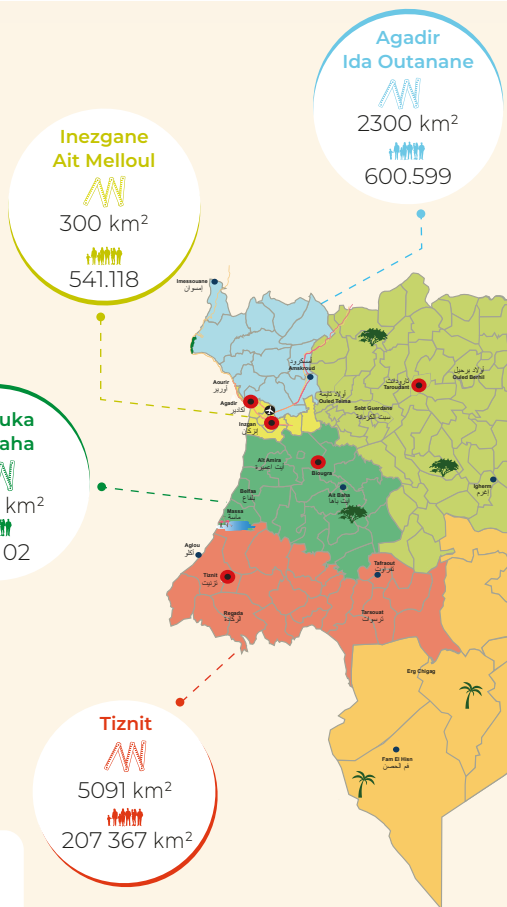

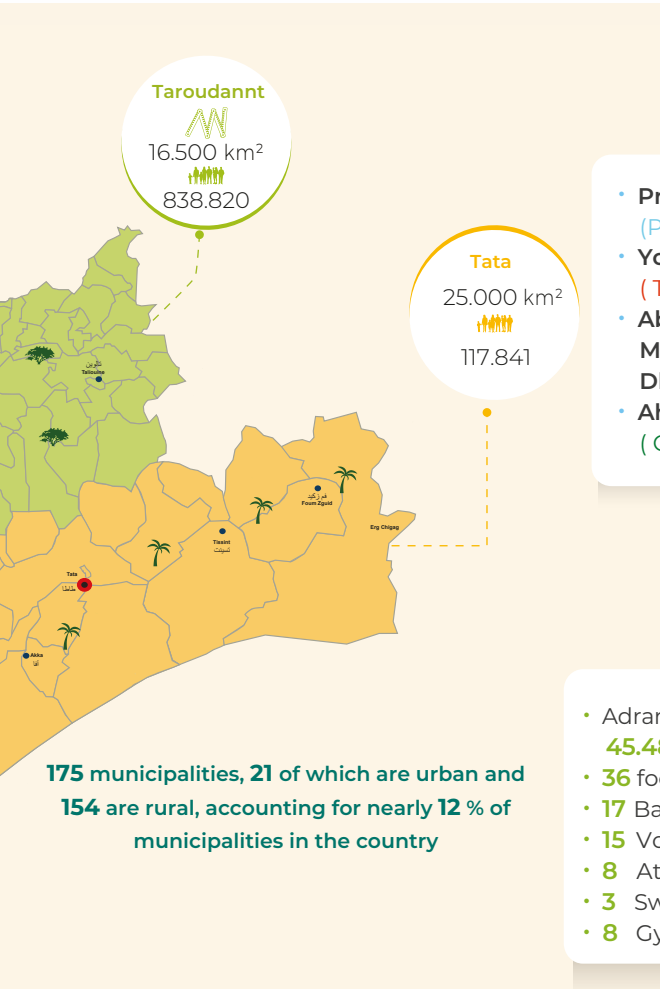

AGRICULTURE

Souss Massa, an agricultural Region :

Boasting of promising and varied production networks, the agricultural sector in Souss Massa, the first exporting region of citrus fruits and vegetables at the national level, offers great opportunities for both national and international investment. According to stats of the Regional Agricultural Development Office, this sector represents 85% of vegetable exports, 65% of citrus fruits' exports, 15% of dairy production and 86% of Argan tree production. It generates 33 million working days (man-day) per year.

A Region with Great Potential :

Fisheries is the third economic pillar of Souss Massa alongside Agriculture and Tourism, with its abundant fishery resources, the area has taken up today the challenge towards a rational and sustainable management.

The Region has also gained a boost on in the sector of aquaculture. 23 aquaculture projects were selected as part of two public invitations by the National Aquaculture Development Agency (ANDA). The investment amount is 400 million MAD, ultimately direct jobs are 620. 60 production units will thus exploit 900 ha to produce 62 000 tons/a year of selffish and seaweeds. Totaling 78% of forecasts of the Aquacultural Plan estimated at 80 000 tons per annum.

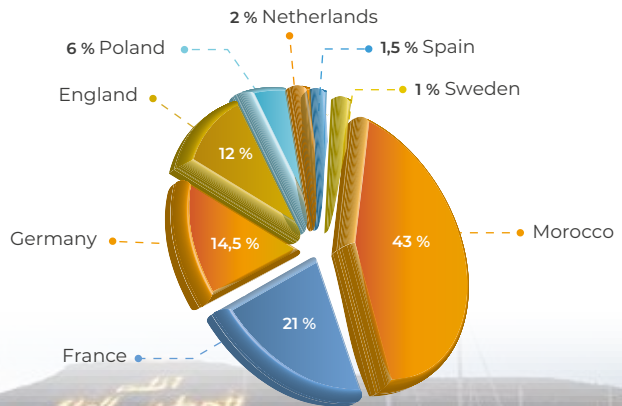

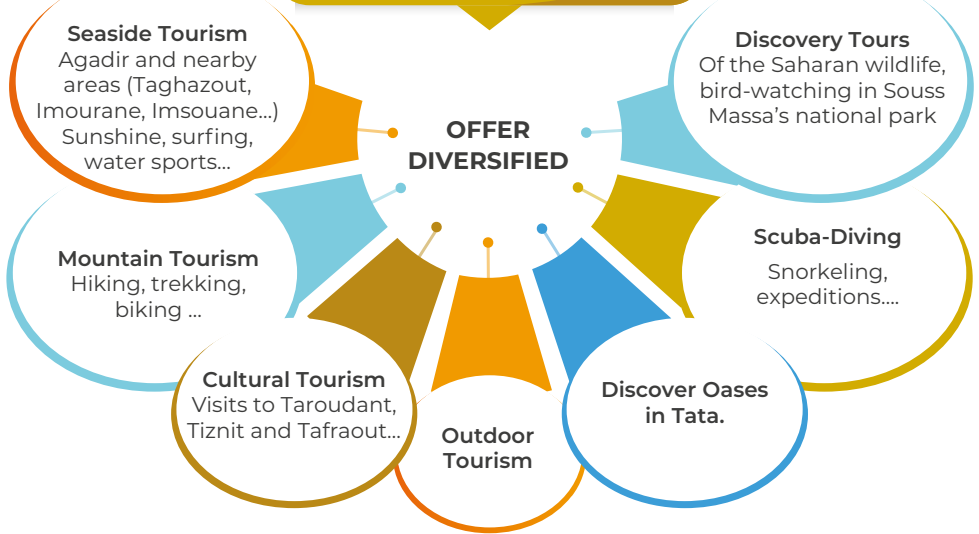

Moreover, Souss Massa is the first region to have implemented the National Plan of Industrial Growth, an extension of the Plan Emergence. This industrialization strategy that created added value and jobs, aims to increase the role of industry in the national GDP. The aim is to move from 14% to 23% by the beginning of 2020.

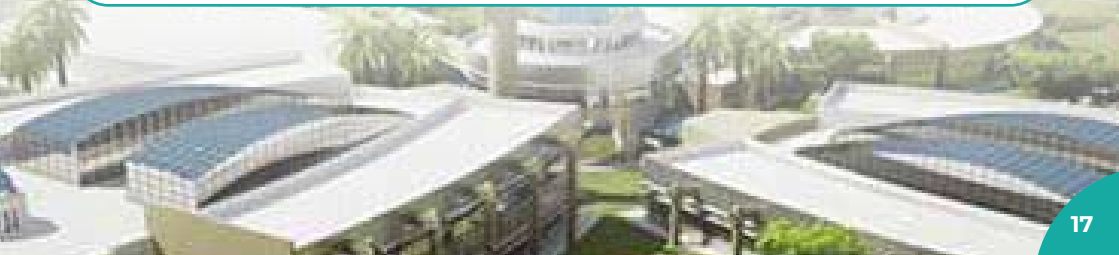

In Souss Massa, the handicraft sector reflects the diversity of the local culture, it is a traditional knowledge. Babouches of Tafraout, brooches and jewelry of Tiznit, local pottery and many others, have always attracted clients with their locally unique trademarks. Their regional labels and marks ensure their good quality and their geographical origins.

Given the importance of the handicraft sector for the region's socioeconomic development, a strategy has been set up to mentor craftsmen and artisans, mainly in vocational training and continuous training.

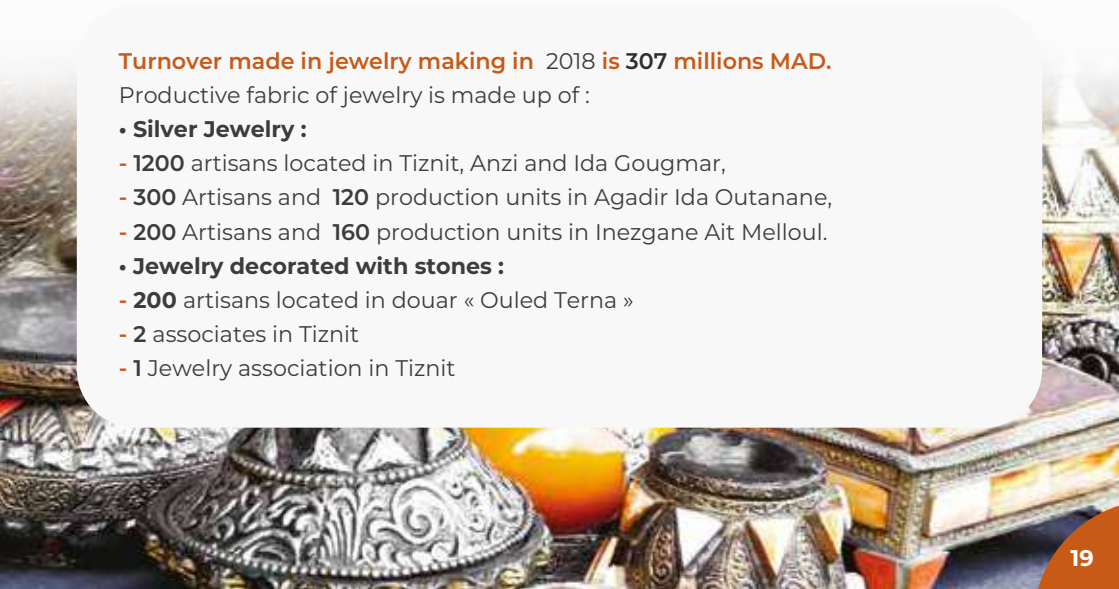

EDUCATION

In accordance with the Royal guidelines announced in the speeches made on July 29th and August 20th in 2018, Souss Massa has invested in supporting schooling children in remote rural areas. Many efforts have been made to prevent school drop-out, limit overcrowding in classes and stop teaching multiple grades in one classroom, renovate schools and boarding schools, 150 schools will be built by 2021.

The aim is to improve the teaching model and enhance education in the region.

On a Higher Education level, almost all disciplines and branches are covered and taught in the Souss Massa region. For officials in the sector, the issue is to adapt offered trainings to the local job market.

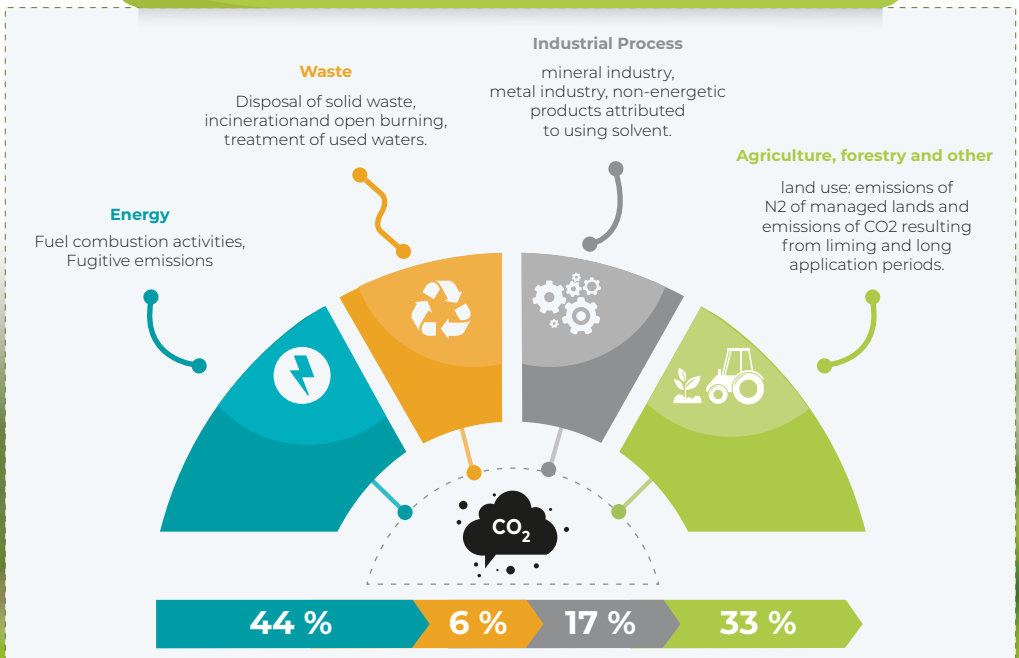
Souss Massa : a region of commitment

The Souss Massa region is the first in Morocco to have put in place a territorial plan to fight Climate Change. This instrument of environmental governance is a real roadmap in the region's territory that suffers from lack of water resources due to climate change. Souss Massa is also the first region to launch a regional detection system of hazardous products: detecting, reporting and checking in October 2018.
